Thank you to all the pupils for joining in the fun wearing their Christmas jumpers and contributing to the school's charities. The jumpers were great again this year!




'& Juliet' London Theatre Trip




Year 5 and 6 Trip






Samba Workshop



Cardiff University Masterclass Project with A Level History Pupils

This week my history class and I went on a trip to the National Welsh Library in Aberystwyth. We were greeted by Dr Marion Loeffler, a Reader in Welsh History from Cardiff University. I am certain that this experience with a University Reader was extremely beneficial for me. It provided me with an insight into the type of work that is completed at University and enabled me to strengthen my ability to thoroughly analyse primary sources, which will be a crucial skill for me whilst at university. During this project we learned about the History of Wales and focused on a riot that took place in Merthyr Tydfil in 1800 due to famine. I particularly enjoyed this experience as I was able to apply my own knowledge of the French Revolution. The French Revolution was a major contributor to the industrial revolution in Wales and therefore the information we learned intertwined with much of the content from my history A Level course. My prior knowledge on the subject made the experience significantly more enjoyable. At the library I also was provided with the opportunity to present my ideas and annotations to the rest of the room. Not only did this project provide me with analysing skills but it also enabled me to hone my communication and presentation skills that will be very crucial for me in my future career. We also walked down the the town and were able to explore the shops and cafes with my friends.
